SCHOOL ADVISORY BOARD MEETING
May 23, 2016, 5:00 P.M

The regular meeting of the School Advisory Board of the City of Oakland Park, Florida was called to order at 5:03 p.m. by Chair Naylor.

1A. Item added to the Agenda- Library & Volunteer Services Presentation

Lisa Testa, Library Manager for the City of Oakland Park presented on the partnership the library has with the local schools. Programs such as “Ready, Set, Read!” and “Rockin’ Reading Buddies” and summer activities were discussed. Mrs. Testa addressed the concerns of the board in regards to training participants on how to help a child with reading.

Bruce Garrison, Volunteer Program Manager for the City of Oakland Park presented on the partnership his volunteer crops has with the local schools. Programs such as POP Rocks with Northeast High School, Shear Brilliance, and the Vision Works Partnership were discussed.

1. Approval of Minutes- 4. 25.2016

Board Member Batie moved to approve the minutes of 4/25/16. Board Member Mercier seconded the motion. The motion prevailed unanimously.

2. Public Comments

Mrs. Sharon Steven Buitrago, a teacher from Pompano Elementary School is transferring to Oakland Park Elementary School for the 2016/2017 School Year. Mrs. Buitrago expressed her excitement for her new position and interest in joining the Advisory Board and community she lives in.

3. Board Member Reports

Vice Chairman Cherson reported on Floranada Elementary School:

- 1) Mr. Cherson was asked to become Chair of the School Advisory Forum.
- 2) School Improvement Plan was discussed; the district will be interviewing students and staff.
- 3) School Parent Compact, which is well developed at Floranada, with implementation to occur in the 2016-2017 school year.
- 4) Floranada Alumni to become speakers for the 5th graders of 2016-2017, to share with them the magnet middle school experience.
- 5) Extra bond money decision to take place within during the fall of next year.
- 6) Car pick up and dismissal plan is being revised among the School Advisory Committee and the school Principal.

Board Member Mercier reported on Lloyd Estates Elementary School:

- 1) Diversity Committee Meeting discussed curriculum and safety issues throughout the school.
- 2) FSA testing improvement, preliminary reports showing they are number 3 among local schools.
- 3) Unfinished school due to ongoing construction.
- 4) Fourth and Fifth grades participated in a Spanish and Math competition where the school placed well.
- 5) Book contest took place where they achieved first, second and honorable mention.
- 6) Bond money ballots are in and have been voted on.
- 7) Career Day was a success, with many professionals from the city and county were present.

Board Member Batie reported on Oakland Park Elementary School:

- 1) School Advisory Committee still seeking more parent involvement.
- 2) Kindergarten Round Up, the students will have the opportunity to learn Spanish along with English.
- 3) Spring Concert was a success.
- 4) End of the year trips are underway 5th grade is going to Key Largo, 4th grade is going to SeaWorld
- 5) Best Practices for Inclusive Education (B PIE) indicators were discussed in particular increased ESE enrollment with regular enrollment.
- 6) Promotion and Retention protocol was discussed. Primary grades use a diagnostic reading test; K- second grades use a test based on reading, third grade test based on state test.
- 7) Parent Teacher Student Compact was discussed with the parent involvement, stressing the parents check the back packs to see important information.
- 8) Cafeteria issues have been recognized and the school is looking for Volunteers to paint murals to spruce up the interior walls.
- 9) Positive reinforcement, a form of behavior modification will be applied.

- 10) Math Night at McDonalds to take place in June.
- 11) Honor Roll Assembly to take place June.

Chairman Naylor reported on North Andrews Gardens Elementary School:

- 1) Title One Parent Student Compact has been approved by the School Advisory Council
- 2) May 26, 2016 Reading Across Broward Assembly for Power Readers
- 3) End of Year drumming performance on May 26, 2016

Chairman Naylor reported on Northeast High School:

- 1) Funding request for Freshman Camp was approved by School Advisory Council.
- 2) Funding for Speech pathologist was approved by School Advisory Council.
- 3) Smart Bond ballots have been sent out.
- 4) Staff has approved 8 days of Professional Staff Development Waiver
- 5) Positive Behavior Program being developed to apply to the 2016-2017 school year.
- 6) Boys & Girls Track teams went to State, eleven children from each team attended. The girls won 2nd place, the boys had an individual winner.
- 7) Senior Awards, 3.5 million in scholarships given, not including Bright Futures

Student Member Cortes reported on Northeast High School:

- 1) YMCA will begin the second week of summer, open Monday- Thursday from 8:00am – 2:00pm, with trips on Thursdays.
- 2) Mrs. Hernandez spearheaded the Formation parody video called “Frustration” in an attempt to get Northeast on the Ellen Show.
- 3) Graduation to take place on June 4, 2016
- 4) Smart Bond Ballot results are in. Choice One was selected which was the gym scoreboard, the football scoreboard installation, marquee, scoring tables, science equipment, wireless projector, volleyball poles, long jump pit installation, 8 trash receptacles, and school furniture and equipment.
- 5) Jersey Mikes Fundraiser raised \$1836.00 for the band to go to Disney, where they recorded the intro to Tangled with Hollywood studios.
- 6) Underclassman awards to take place on June 2, 2016.

4. **Staff Liaison report**

Liaison Burnett clarified the boards concerns about what effect the board has within the City and the local schools and how effective the School Advisory Board is. Burnett also spoke of the Principals Lunch that was hosted within the city, with key city staff, which was successful.

Liaison Burnett reminded the board that there are no meetings in June or July and the School Advisory Board will start up again in August.

Liaison Burnett reminded that every summer reappointments of the board members will take place.
