


NW 21ST AVENUE MOBILITY IMPROVEMENT/BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), District Four, will widen NW 21st Avenue between Oakland Park Boulevard and Commercial Boulevard to improve mobility. The road widening will accommodate 5-foot buffered bikes lanes in each direction. The existing bridge over the South Florida Water Management District C-13 Canal will be replaced. Other improvements include upgraded signalization, sidewalk replacement, miscellaneous signage, paving, curb and gutter and driveway harmonization.

PROJECT UPDATE

The contractor will be installing drainage just north of the NW 21st Avenue and NW 39th Street intersection. Beginning Friday, May 1, the northbound lane on NW 21st Avenue will be closed and a flagging operation will maintain two-way traffic in the southbound lane for approximately 48 hours.
