- Construct sidewalks at various locations within the Lakeside neighborhood of Oakland Park.
- Relocate signs to meet the minimum horizontal sidewalk clearances to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards.

CONSTRUCTION IMPACTS

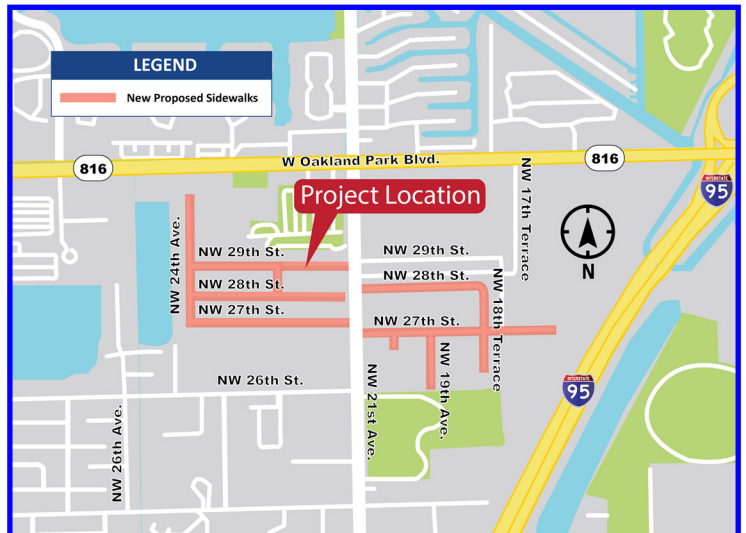
- All work will be done in phases to reduce the impact of construction to the community.
- No full roadway closures will occur.
- Access to private properties will be maintained during construction.
